THE STORY

When two jets crossed the sky over Cape Town in August, the internet had opinions. Most of them came from people who have never flown into this country. **Too Fly For These Haters** doesn't argue. It checks the record: a civil airliner flypast tradition that began in 1995, and a commercial passenger safety record that has held for over four decades.

The timing is deliberate. That tradition started the same year Heritage Day was first celebrated in democratic South Africa. Thirty-one years on, both are still here — which is what this year's Heritage Month theme means by living heritage: not a monument, but a practice still in use.

The verses aren't written in one language, because the township doesn't speak in one. They touch on a vernacular unique to that crucible — people arriving from everywhere, and Sesotho, isiZulu, Afrikaans and English settling into a single way of speaking. Not verse by verse, but line by line, sometimes inside a single bar.

The song runs in three movements: the rituals we keep, the people who practised them, and the numbers that justify the swagger. Every factual claim in it is sourced.

Debut single from Statik Black, a creative designer and rapper from Vosloorus on the East Rand, releasing under his own Chasin' Blaque imprint.
